



The National Association of Diversified Livestock Farmers, Wildlife Breeders (ANGADI), invites the owners of UMAs (Wildlife Management Units) and national and international sport hunters to participate in the XXXV National Sporting Deer Hunting Tournament "THE GIANTS" 2024-2025, according to the following:

BASES

All owners of "Wildlife Management Units" (UMA) who are active members of the National Association of Diversified Livestock Farmers, Wildlife Breeders (ANGADI) and registered through the offices in Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, as well as all national and international hunters who carry out their hunting expeditions in these UMAs and comply with the legal requirements established by the competent authorities (SEMARNAT and SEDENA) for practicing sport hunting in Mexico, can participate in this Tournament.

AWARDS

I. The top three places in each CATEGORY of the subspecies considered within this Tournament will receive a recognition award for both the UMA owner and the hunter.

CATEGORÍAS

- 1) Typical Low Fence Texan White-Tailed Deer (O.v. texanus)
- 2) Atypical Low Fence Texan White-Tailed Deer (O.v. texanus)
- 3) Typical High Fence Texan White-Tailed Deer (O.v. texanus)
- 4) Atypical High Fence Texan White-Tailed Deer (O.v. texanus)
- 5) Carminis White-Tailed Deer (O.v. carminis)
- 6) Miquihuano White-Tailed Deer (O.v. miquihuansensis)
- 7) Veracruz White-Tailed Deer (O.v. veracruzensis)
- 8) Coahuila Mule Deer (O.h. crooki)
- 9) Typical Genetic Improvement (O.v. crossbreeds)
- 10) Atypical Genetic Improvement (O.v. crossbreeds)

SPECIAL PRIZES

II. Only the Texan White-Tailed Deer subspecies (O.v. texanus) in categories 1, 2, 3, and 4 will be eligible for special prizes. The first place in each SPECIAL PRIZE will receive a recognition award for the hunter.

1. EIGHT POINTS:

The antler basket with 8 typical points with the highest score according to Boone & Crockett Gross. The antler basket that qualifies for the Tournament in the 8 typical points category will be the one with 4 points on each main beam, known as G1, G2, G3, and the main beam (measurable or not), and if it has abnormal points, they should not exceed 3 inches, and these will not be considered in the final score. If evidence shows there were more normal points, it will not be considered an 8-point basket.

2. MOST POINTS:

The antlers with the most defined "points" according to the official Boone & Crockett Club measurement system (G's). In case of a tie, the basket with the highest score will be considered.

3. LARGEST SPREAD:

The antler basket with the widest spread according to Boone & Crockett Gross measurement system. There will be no limitation on the maximum length of the main beams for this category.

4. GREATEST MASS:

The antler basket with the highest mass. Mass is considered the sum of the four circumferences of each main beam, according to Boone &

Crockett Gross (H's); in case of a tie, the basket with the highest score will be considered.

5. LONGEST TIME:

La The longest time is considered a point extending from the main beam, either from the inner side, outer side, or top, and extends upward, counted as a normal point (G's) according to Boone & Crockett Club. In case of a tie, the basket with the highest score will be considered.

6. LONGEST BROW TINE:

La The antler basket with the longest brow tine. A brow tine is considered a point extending from the main beam, either from the inner, outer, or lower side, and extending downward; in case of a tie, the basket with the highest score will be considered.

7. LONGEST MAIN BEAM:

La The antler basket with the longest main beam (right or left); in case of a tie, the basket with the highest score will be considered.

8. NINE POINTS:

The antler basket with 9 typical points with the highest score in Boone & Crockett Gross. The basket that qualifies for the Tournament in the 9 typical points category will be the one with 4 and 5 typical points on each of the main beams known as G1, G2, G3, G4, and the main beam. Abnormal points should not exceed 3 inches and will not be counted in the final score. If there is evidence of more normal points, it will not be considered a 9-point basket.

9. SEVEN POINTS:

The antler basket with 7 typical points with the highest score in Boone & Crockett Gross. The basket that qualifies for the Tournament in the 7 typical points category will be the one with 3 and 4 typical points on each of the main beams, known as G1, G2, G3, and the main beam. No abnormal points are allowed. If there is evidence of more points, it will not be considered a 7-point basket.

10. SIX POINTS:

The antler basket with 6 typical points with the highest score in Boone & Crockett Gross. The basket that qualifies for the Tournament in the 6 typical points category will be the one with 3 typical points on each main beam, known as G1, G2, and the main beam. No abnormal points are allowed. If there is evidence of more points, it will not be considered a 6-point basket.

11. ARCHERY HUNTING:

To the antler basket with the highest score in Boone & Crockett Gross, hunted with bow and arrow. The hunter or member must provide clear proof (photograph) that the specimens in this category were hunted with this method.

12. WOMENS AWARD:

To the woman who presents a trophy with the highest typical or atypical score. Proof must be provided that the specimen was hunted by the woman.

13. YOUTH AWARD:

To a hunter aged 16 or younger who presents a trophy with the highest typical or atypical score. Proof must be provided that the specimen was hunted by the minor, who must always be accompanied by a parent or guardian for their safety.

- I. **Club 140+ (8 points)** Hunters who participate in this special prize and do not place in the top three but obtain a trophy scoring 140 Boone & Crockett Gross or more will be recognized as members of the 140+ Hunter's Club and will receive a recognition award and a "Los Gigantes" Tournament shirt.
- II. **CLUB 160+** Hunters who do not place in the awards for each category but obtain a trophy scoring 160 Boone &

Crockett Gross or more will be recognized as members of the 160+ Hunter's Club and will receive a recognition award and a "Los Gigantes" Tournament jacket.

- III. **CLUB 200+** Hunters who do not place in the awards for each category but obtain a trophy scoring 200 Boone & Crockett Gross or more will be recognized as members of the 200+ Hunter's Club and will receive a recognition award and a "Los Gigantes" Tournament jacket.

IV. **PARTICIPATION** A cap with the Tournament logo will be given to every hunter who registers their deer. All participants are invited to the ANGADI Annual Convention to be held in 2025, and they will be notified in due time.

REGULATIONS

- i) It is the responsibility of all members to read and comply with the rules and regulations of the Tournament, as well as to ensure that their hunters follow these regulations. Any voluntary or involuntary omission of these rules and regulations will disqualify the presented trophy from the Tournament.
- ii) Any trophy presented for measurement for registration in the Tournament may be subject to investigation regarding the circumstances in which it was harvested, including, if necessary, a polygraph test for the hunter and/or the member.
- iii) The certification of the subspecies of white-tailed deer will be based on the official registration of the UMA. If for any reason the subspecies indicated in the UMA does not match the actual subspecies, the UMA owner must request in writing the immediate change through ANGADI's headquarters so that the necessary changes are processed, with the understanding that the change must be made and confirmed before the start of the official 2024-2025 hunting season.
- iv) Deer registered in this Tournament must have been conceived in Mexico. For the purposes of this Tournament, deer conceived through artificial insemination with semen from outside Mexico will be considered conceived outside of Mexico, and therefore will fall under category No. 9 - Genetic Improvement.
- v) Any deer that was captured or born in breeding pens and returned to the wild will not be accepted in the Tournament unless at least one year has passed since its release before it is harvested.
- vi) Only deer harvested in UMAs that process their payment labels through ANGADI's National Headquarters in Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, will be accepted for registration in the Tournament.
- vii) The trophies will be registered by the accredited hunter or the UMA owner.
- viii) The trophies presented for measurement must have the corresponding payment label or tag attached to the antler basket.
- ix) Trophies can be presented for measurement at ANGADI's headquarters in Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, as well as at the Bernardo Reyes Bridge in Colombia, Nuevo León.
- x) During the measurement, neither the hunter nor the UMA owner may be present.
- xi) The measurement of the presented trophies will be carried out by the judges appointed by the Organizing Committee of this event, as listed below:

- xii) The antlers of the presented trophies will be measured according to the official Boone & Crockett Club (B&C) Gross system.
- xiii) This Committee has adopted the B&C "Gross" variant in order to respect the trophy and give it the maximum possible score for its antlers.
- xiv) The classification of antlers as "typical" or "atypical" will be determined based on the score obtained from measuring the atypical (abnormal) points according to the Boone & Crockett Gross system. Any antler set with atypical points exceeding 8 points will be classified as "atypical"; those with atypical points equal to or less than 8 points will be classified as "typical".
- xv) Antlers awarded in any of the top three places in either the "typical" or "atypical" classification cannot participate in any of the 13 special categories, nor can they compete against each other. Antlers presented for measurement that qualify for more than one special prize can only participate in one, with the highest rank being the deciding factor. If the same antler qualifies for multiple special prizes with the same score, it will only compete in the most important special prize. The special prizes are listed according to their rank, with No. 1 being the most important.
- xvi) The reception for measuring antlers will be available from the first day of the hunting season until the last day of the season, according to the calendar published by the state wildlife authorities. However, the closing date, as decided by the committee, will be the same for all three states.

Coahuila: White-tailed Deer from November 15, 2024, to January 26, 2025.

Nuevo León: White-tailed Deer from November 15, 2024, to February 9, 2025

Tamaulipas White-tailed Deer from November 22, 2024, to February 4, 2025.

This will also apply to UMAs that, according to their "management plan," have authorized seasons different from the general ones.

The measurement hours for trophies are as follows:

ANGADI Headquarters in Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas:
Monday to Saturday from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM. Offices in Colombia, Nuevo León: Monday to Sunday from 9:30 AM to 5:00 PM.

Any issues not addressed in this call or any disputes will be resolved by the Organizing Committee and the accredited judges, and their decision will be final.

In the event of a tie in any of the categories or special prizes, the prize will be awarded to the participants according to this call.
